



BUDGET PROCESS

Agency-level Planning

Agencies submit their budget requests to the Mayor.

Mayor's Proposal

Mayor submits a proposed budget to the DC Council (April 3)

Final Budget

Council Committees make changes (May 8 - May 10)
Then, the full Council votes on a final budget.

(1st Vote: May 29, 2nd Vote: June 12)

Performance Oversight Hearings

Council Committees hold public hearings about how each Agency is serving residents needs and their effectiveness in implementing last year's budget.

Budget Oversight Hearings

Council Committees hold public hearings about each Agency's proposed budgets for the next fiscal year.

(April 4 - May 3)



COMMITTEE PROCESS

- Mayor's Budget Proposal is Submitted to Council
- Committee Process:
 - Referral: Individual Agency budgets are referred to Council Committees with Jurisdiction
 - Hearings: Committee holds budget oversight hearings on each agency within their purview, where they hear from the public and agency leadership
 - Committee Markup: Committee makes proposed changes to agency budgets based on what they learn from these hearings and public engagement
- Committee versions are consolidated into a new package that is voted on by the full Council (twice!)
 - Note: There is additional engagement and changes at the full Council stage

ROLE OF PUBLIC FEEDBACK

- Identify funding gaps or cuts that should be restored
- Identify new/additional areas of investment
- Suggest questions for Committee to ask Agency
- Important budget changes are often made in response to public feedback
 - It's a big budget; the more eyes on it the better!

YOUR VOICE MATTERS



Testify at a Budget Oversight Hearing



Submit a written or voicemail testimony



Contact Committee and your Councilmember (between now and June - earlier the better!)



TESTIFYING LIVE (VIRTUAL OR IN-PERSON)

Before you testify:

- 1. Register at the Council's Hearing Website 2 business days before
- 2. Language or ASL interpretation: request 5 business days before
- 3. Write your testimony
- 4. **Upload** your written testimony on the Council's Hearing page
- 5. Practice reading at loud

TIPS FOR WRITING TESTIMONY

In written testimony:

- Greet the Committee Chairperson, Committee members, and staff
- Introduce yourself and, if applicable, your experience/interest in the topic
- **Explain** why you think a particular policy or program is important. Share any **personal experience** with the policy or program.
- Be clear about your specific asks and recommendations, to the extent possible.
- Close by thanking the Committee for the opportunity to testify.

Note:

Following your testimony, the Committee may ask follow-up questions.

Call, email, or schedule a meeting with Council offices throughout the process

- Share your concerns and recommendations
- To Contact a <u>Committee</u>: email the Committee Chairperson and Committee
